

## The National Labor Relations Board and the Changing Law

Webinar Series | June 2, June 9 & June 16, 6:30-8:30pm

In this three-part series, we will review the structure of the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) and the National Labor Relations Act (NLRA). The Board's interpretation of the Act typically changes through proceedings brought before the Board and more recently through federal rule making. Learn more about the Board's recent rule making on the election process and joint employer rule, and examine the recent NLRB rulings that change the interpretation of the Act.



### The Role & Structure of the NLRB

In our first class, we will review the basics of the National Labor Relations Act, as well as the structure of the National Labor Relations Board. This will include a discussion of the appointment and role of Board members, of the General Counsel to the Board, the Regional Offices, and the NLRB's use of federal rule making to change policy.



### The NLRB's Recent Rule Making to Change Policy

**June 9, 2020 | 6:30-8:30pm**

In this session, we will focus exclusively on the NLRB's changes to policy through rule making. This will include a look at the 2019 rule changing election procedures, as well as an examination of other recent NLRB rules that altered the Board's joint employer standard, treatment of graduate students, and access to employer property.



### The NLRB Case Decisions Changing Policy

**June 16, 2020 | 6:30-8:30pm**

In the final session, we will review the host of recent changes made by the Board through Unfair Labor Practice caselaw. This includes a discussion of the Board's treatment of Duty of Fair Representation cases, dues checkoff, unilateral changes, and deferral of unfair labor practices to arbitration. Other recent NLRB caselaw will also be discussed.
