Institute description

This three-week hybrid course explores the genesis of production standards, the scientific management theory of Fredrick Taylor, the fundamentals for setting production standards, and the characteristics of various systems in use today. Developing a union philosophy around the use of standards and how these systems intersect with grievance procedures and contract bargaining is also discussed. Optional live Q/A sessions via Zoom on Feb 1 and Feb 8 from 6:30 – 7:00 p.m. (CT).

About online hybrid institutes

The hybrid institute is an online class coupling one-week instructional units with scheduled live classroom times. Each unit contains readings, short videos, activities, and student discussion boards with weekly deadlines that explores a given topic. Participants may access the course anytime 24/7 to complete the weekly units whenever it fits their schedule.
