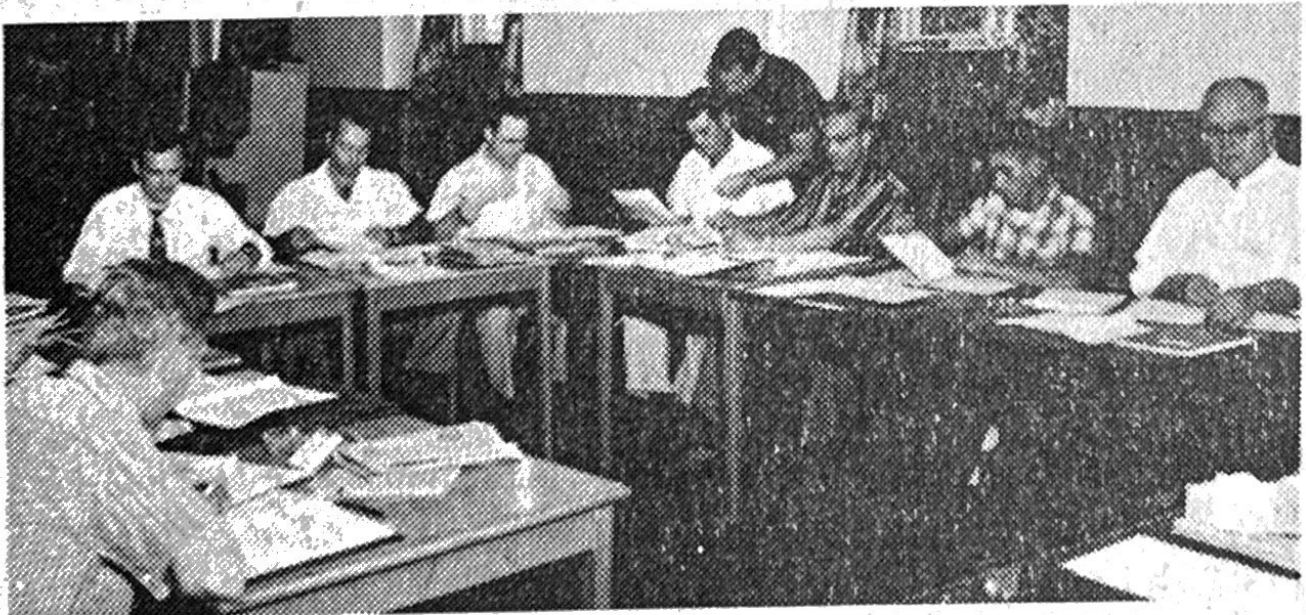

UNION STAFF TRAINING: An Expanding Field

Taft-Hartley....NLRB proceedings....Health and Welfare Fund Administration....Arbitration....Time Study and Job Evaluation....Labor Journalism.... these are only some of the areas of concern for union representatives in these changing times. The increasing demand for staff training presents a real challenge to International Unions, the School for Workers, and other university workers education programs.

The School in Wisconsin is already active in this field and plans to continue and expand such services. A background of experience has been developed in programs already conducted in labor journalism, time study, health and welfare bargaining, arbitration, and labor law. The School welcomes opportunities to work cooperatively with international unions and other labor groups in staff training; the need is clear and it must be met.
