The Program

The program is designed to give you information to increase your understanding, to provide a time for sharing experiences and discussing your ideas, and to give practice in the skills you need as a member of your union.

The main topics to be covered are:

Employee-Management Relations –

human relations for public employees, personnel practices and the law, handling grievances in public employment.

Local Union Administration –

the structure of the union, effective committees, improving meetings, speech and parliamentary procedure, relations with the community, and relations with the labor movement.

Legislative Education –

the relation between legislation and public employee unions, understanding legislative activity, the make-up of the Wisconsin Legislature, and an analysis of Wisconsin voting.
