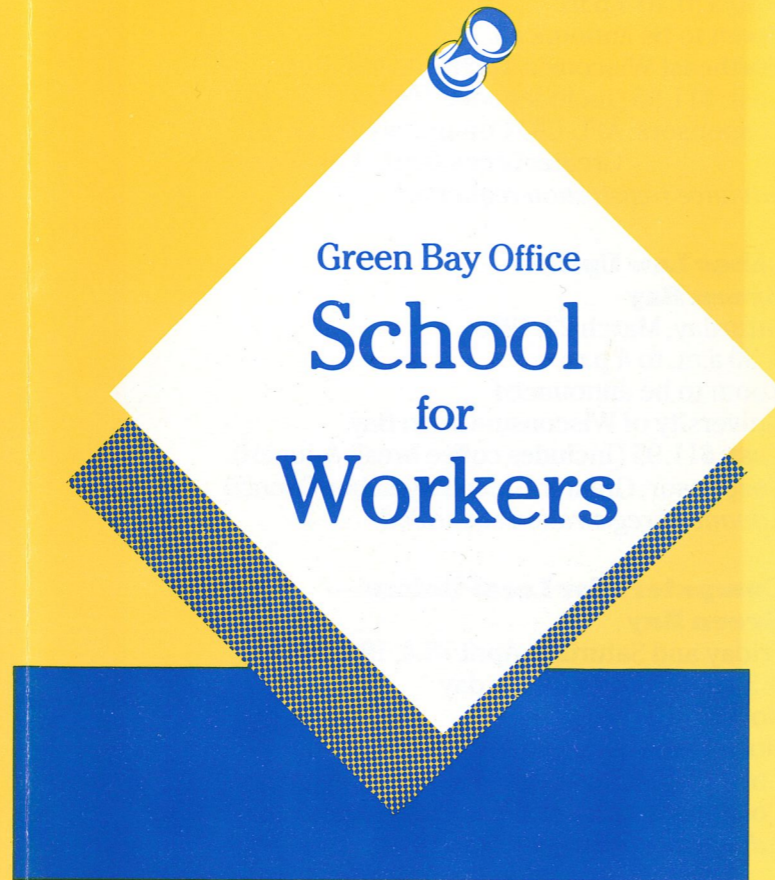

The School for Workers in Green Bay

The Green Bay office of the School for Workers was opened at the campus of the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay in 1978. It is part of the statewide labor education program offered by the University of Wisconsin-Extension. The special mission of the Green Bay office is to provide workers living in the Northeastern counties of Wisconsin with opportunities for continuing education in subjects related to their activities as union members, officers, and staff representatives. It attempts to do this through a program of daytime, evening and weekend classes, and one and two day workshops and through advisory services to union members, officers and staff. All programs include a process of joint planning with the organizations involved in a proposed program. Instruction is provided by the full time staff of the School for Workers statewide supplemented as needed by experts from the University, government, the community and the labor movement. The Green Bay office works closely with people in the region who are responsible for educational programming for local unions and central bodies and provides a gateway to resources available at the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay.

Community Classes

Classes are offered in the communities of Northeastern Wisconsin on a three season schedule, beginning in the fall, early winter and spring. They generally meet once a week for six weeks, two and one-half hours per session, either at night for day workers and/or during the day for night shift workers. Classes are sponsored jointly by the Green Bay Office, School for Workers; the cooperating vocational, technical and adult education campuses in the community; and the labor group which has requested the class. The cost is shared by these three groups through the University budget, the VTAE budget and the registration fee charged to participants by the local vocational school.

Special Workshops and Conferences

One and two day workshops and conferences covering a variety of topics are offered several times during the year. The subject matter for any given program is chosen after consultation with labor union leaders in the region. Resources used in workshops and conferences are drawn from the local labor movement, the School for Workers, the VTAE campus in the community, and the Office of Outreach, University of Wisconsin-Green Bay.

Mini-Classes

Mini-classes can be arranged in your community during the fall, winter or spring. The day, time, length, and location are set to meet the needs of the local union requesting the program. Classes may be arranged in cooperation with the local vocational, technical and adult school (in which case cost are shared) or directly with the School for Workers (in which case the labor group assumes the cost). The subject matter covered in mini-classes can be varied to fit the needs of the sponsoring labor organization. Examples of class topics are:

Effective Grievance Handling
Preparation for Contract Negotiation
Job Classification and Time Study
Occupational Safety and Health
Labor Law
Steward Training
Public Speaking and Parliamentary Procedure
Preretirement Education

To obtain a mini-class for your organization:

1. Make a decision as to the desired subject and the preferred day of the week, starting date and time.
2. Telephone or write the Green Bay office of the School for Workers so that arrangements as to place, instructor, registration fee, publicity, etc. can be made well in advance of desired date of the program.
