

## About the School for Workers...

Established as the first university-based worker education program in North America in 1925, the School for Workers is part of the University of Wisconsin-Extension. The School for Workers has a long tradition of providing worker safety and health training.

✓ The School for Workers was one of the first recipients of an OSHA worker safety and health training grant, in 1971. Since that time, we have regularly offered classes, conferences and institutes in occupational safety and health topics.

✓ Since 1985, the School for Workers has provided asbestos abatement training to workers, contractors, employers and officials. Under the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act of 1986, we provide training leading to certification for workers, contractors, inspectors and management planners. The School for Workers is certified for this purpose by both the Department of Health and Social Services and the Environmental Protection Agency.

✓ The School for Workers is an active participant in the Midwest Consortium for Hazardous Waste Worker Training, one of eleven programs in the U.S. funded by the National Institute for Environmental Health Sciences to develop and deliver training to hazardous waste workers covered by the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act.

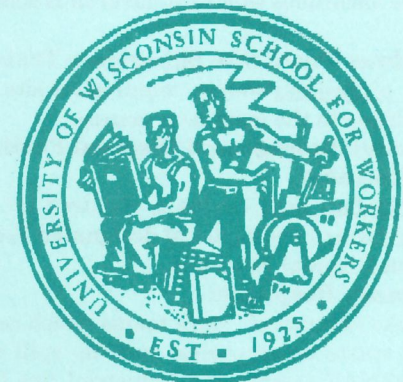

## Who should attend?

The Midwest Consortium for Hazardous Waste Worker Training has developed training programs to meet the requirements of OSHA standard 1910.120 for personnel who work with hazardous waste. There are four specific training programs offered:

### 1. Hazardous Waste Site Worker Training:

This forty-hour course is required for those workers who handle hazardous wastes at hazardous waste clean-up sites.

### 2. Hazardous Waste Site Supervisor Training:

This is an eight-hour course required for site supervisors in addition to the forty hour course.

### 3. Treatment, Storage and Disposal Facility Worker Training:

This twenty-four hour course is required for workers who handle hazardous wastes at designated Treatment, Storage and Disposal Facilities.

### 4. Emergency Response:

Workers who are part of work teams which respond to hazardous waste emergencies, such as spill response teams, HAZMAT teams, and industrial fire brigades. This is a twenty-four hour course.

## What the courses will include:

Each of these four courses will include classroom lecture and discussion, case studies and a substantial amount of "hands-on" training. The forty-hour course will devote over one-half day to a site simulation exercise. Areas to be covered include:

1. Hazard recognition and control
2. Work practices
3. Emergency procedures
4. Respiratory protection and PPE
5. Monitoring
6. Rights and responsibilities

Participants will be expected to wear a variety of respiratory and personal protective equipment ensembles during this course which may be physically stressful to some individuals. A medical release will therefore be required of each participant. This release will be mailed upon receipt of pre-registration materials.
