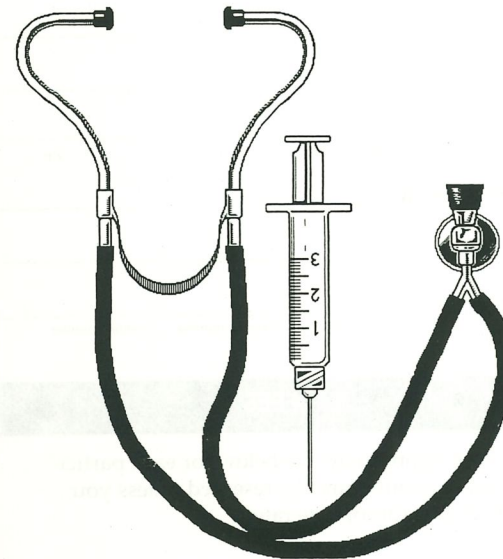

It seems that everybody from Lee Iaccoca to Lane Kirkland is voicing strong opinions about the importance of the issue and what needs to be done.

This conference will concentrate on practical approaches which can be initiated by labor and management representatives working together to deal with a problem of common interest and importance. 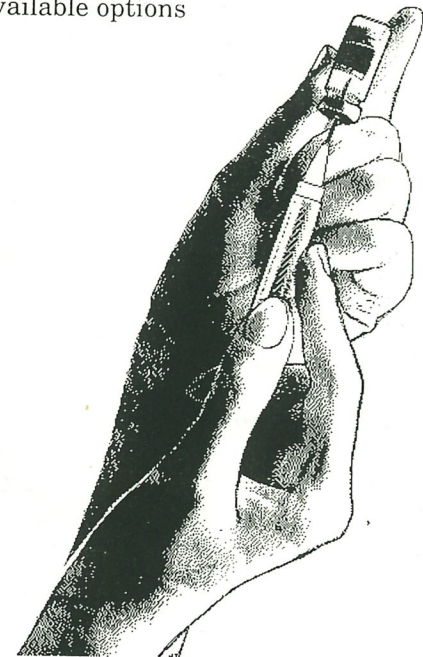
### Who Should Attend?
