ADVANCED ERGONOMICS

This program is a four and one-half day session that is a follow-up to the Ergonomics for Joint Committees program. The purpose of the training is to give participants opportunities to learn and develop ergonomic skills that can be taken back to their respective work places.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?
